Top Vase (Class 72a)

1. The **Top Vase** is for a vase of mixed flowers containing 5 to 10 stems from at least two different kinds of plants: two varieties of the same flower are not two kinds of plants.
2. The display will be judged to a **total of 35 points**, comprising **25 points** for colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display; and **10 points** for overall presentation and effect of plants in the vase. Judging is in accordance with standard RHS rules
3. Display should show flower head only with no seeds or berries
4. The vase may be any size or shape but in proportion to the display; no marks are awarded for the vase.
5. No accessories, such as bows or additional foliage, are allowed: foliage grown naturally from the flower stem and still attached is allowed as is packing material to keep stems upright and in place.

Top Tray (Class 72b)

1. The **Top Tray** is for a display of three types of vegetables from fifteen: 3 carrots, 2 cauliflowers, 3 onions, 3 parsnips, 6 pods peas, 3 potatoes, 6 runner beans, 6 tomatoes, 6 french beans, 2 sweetcorn, 3 pepper, 2 Cucumber, 3 courgettes, 3 red beet, 2 aubergines.
2. Each vegetable type is judged to a **total of 20 points**, comprising **7 points** for size, shape and colour; **7 points** for condition; and **6 points** for uniformity **(Total mark out of 60)**

Judging is in accordance with standard RHS rules

3. Vegetables are to be displayed for effect within an area measuring 18" by 24" without bending any part of them; no part of the exhibit may exceed the size of the tray.
4. A black cloth is permitted or the tray can be painted.
5. Parsley may be used for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories such as plates, sand, rings etc. will be allowed.
6. Tops of onions are to be tied or whipped using raffia.

Note: Garden News are not supporting this competition in 2022. Instead, the best exhibit in each category will win a £10 St John's Garden Centre Voucher.

1. Completed entry forms with entry fees must be received by the Secretary of the Show no later than 7 pm on Thursday 4 August. Absolutely no late entries: telephone or email entries will not be accepted.
2. All exhibits to be staged by 10 am Saturday morning 6 Aug. (Exhibitors are required to leave the hall by this time).
3. Exhibits must be removed before 6 pm Saturday 6 Aug. Items left after this time will not be retained.
4. Presentations and prize giving to take place late afternoon.
5. Entry fee for each exhibit is 10p unless otherwise stated.
6. Prize money is 1st....30p, 2nd....20p, 3rd....10p. Top Tray and Top Vase prizes are vouchers for £10.00
7. No more than two entries in any single class from any one person.
8. If the judges are of the opinion that entries are not up to standard, 1st, 2nd or 3rd prizes may be withheld.
9. Unless there are more than three exhibits, the third prize may be withheld at the discretion of the judges.
10. The decision of the judges is final.
11. All exhibits must be grown or produced by the exhibitor.
12. The committee reserves the right to visit any exhibitor's garden or allotment.
13. Exhibitors must provide their own trays, dishes and baskets or other container.
